Contest Rules

1. Open to students of Social Work (BSW, MSW, or related fields).
2. Story must reflect social work values, principles, methods, and skills.
3. Six characters are mandatory: Social Worker, Client, Parent, and three characters of your choice.
4. Story must be presented in character boxes (comic strip or storyboard style).
5. Can be hand-drawn or digitally created; must be original work (no copying).
6. Language may be English, Hindi, or both.
7. Minimum 12 boxes and maximum 36 boxes.
8. No discriminatory, offensive, or harmful content; maintain confidentiality (no real names or sensitive details).
9. Submit in PDF or image format; include your name, course, year, and institution on a separate cover page.
10. Judging criteria: relevance to theme, creativity, originality, clarity, and impact.
11. Deadline: Aug 20, 2025. Late entries will not be accepted.

What to Do

- Create a story that reflects social work values, principles, methods, and skills. Your story should include a minimum of 2 characters and a maximum of 6 characters. The characters can be of your choice (you can create them as per your imagination – they could be friends, community members, teachers, neighbors, etc.).

Format

- Present your story using character boxes (like a comic strip, storyboard, or illustrated sequence).
- You may create it by hand (drawing) or digitally (using any software or app).
- Be as visual and expressive as possible – use dialogues, expressions, and scenes that bring the social work process to life.



➔ **Example**

Guidelines

- Your story should clearly depict core aspects of social work – such as empathy, dignity, self-determination, advocacy, or community engagement.
- You can highlight methods like casework, group work, community organization, social action, or research.
- Show at least one skill in action – such as active listening, interviewing, counselling, problem-solving, conflict resolution, or networking.
- Keep it creative, relatable, and respectful.

Prize

- Five best entries will be suitably rewarded, and all participants will get a certificate of appreciation/participation.

Tips for a Strong Entry

- Give each character a unique personality.
- Show change or resolution – how the situation improved because of social work.
- Make your visuals engaging and easy to follow.
